

ADMINISTRATIVE CODE



1- FEDERATION RULES

The President, the Executive President Committee and the Presidents of the Commissions are elected every 4 years.

Executive Committee: In charge of the Administrative Code, prepares the work of the Commissions.

2- MEMBERS

Association's affiliation:

Any association (with tables and players) with a minimum of 10 players can affiliate to FTSI.

Member's Federation fee:

Each Association must pay a yearly fee for FTSI membership, the yearly fee is INR 7500.

Member associations and their officials, coaches and players are not to conduct any activities, or otherwise, associated with any representative of a suspended Institution/club(member or non member) or member association, its officials, coaches, judges, players, etc. In case of any infringement of this rule, the provisions for suspensions and sanctions specified in the FTSI Disciplinary Rules shall apply.

a) Conditions for joining FTSI

The member associations:

- must be organized according to statutes acceptable by the FTSI
- must fairly represent the interest of table soccer players in their respective states.
- must hold an annual General Assembly and/or have another process of election of the Board
- must have at least 10 licensed players of Table Soccer
- must pay membership fees established by the General Assembly of the FTSI
- Under exceptional circumstances, more than one state association within the same state may become an Associate Member of the FTSI

b) Required documents:

- Membership application form
- Association's statutes
- Registration of the Association as a non-profit organization
- List of the Executive Committee's members (names, contact No. and addresses)
- Brief history/report of the organization's activities
- Financial statement
- List of active members (males, females, juniors)
 - Moreover, the documents and information mentioned below can help the FTSI Executive Committee decide to accept or refuse a candidate association:
 - Website
 - evidence of / information about state tournaments or other important events (e.g. photos, videos,)
 - evidence of / information about state team entering in national competitions
 - evidence of / information about regional reach within the state
 - publication of a newsletter (paper or electronic...) or any other communication channel for the members
 - development programme of table soccer; organization on a state level
 - reference from at least one FTSI member

3- PLAYERS

- **Player's affiliation:**

Players affiliate to association and receive a licence number from FTSI.

- **Players Federation fee:**

The fee for a player to affiliate to FTSI is INR450/year

The total fee for a player for registration is made with National fee + Association fee

4- LICENCES

- COMPULSORY CHARACTER

- The FTSI/ITSF licence is compulsory for any table soccer player entering an official FTSI or ITSF event. No entry shall be valid if the competitor's name is not registered with his/her FTSI licence number. The licence is valid for the season in progress.
- This licence is also compulsory for the following individuals:
 - Members of the Executive Committee and members of the FTSI Commissions;
 - FTSI referees;
 - Any manager of an FTSI member association.

- LICENCE DELIVERY

1. The FTSI issues licences to these individuals through their state associations.
2. Any request for a licence or for renewal of a licence must be made to the FTSI administrative office as soon as the corresponding fee has effectively been paid to the FTSI. The fee is set (in INR) by each annual General Assembly for the following season. A licence may only be issued if the following information is supplied: last name, first name, address, birth date, sex, personal mailing address.
3. FTSI may grant a National/International licence to a player who lives in a country where there is no state association member of the FTSI. It allows player to compete in FTSI tour & ITSF World Tour, except World Cup and World Championships.

- LICENCE PRESENTATION

1. Organizers of FTSI official competitions must ensure that each player holds a valid FTSI/ITSF licence for the current season before accepting their registration.
2. Any organizer who infringes rule (above mentioned) is liable to the penalties provided for in the FTSI Disciplinary Rules.

5- COMMISSIONS

Functioning and role of the Commissions:

Disciplinary Commission: in charge of the application of the Disciplinary Code

Sport Commission: in charge of the application of the Sport Code

Education, Rules and Referees Commission: In charge of the management of the rules, training and managing of the referees and promotion of the sport Table Soccer in all kind of structures (schools, youth centres, etc.)

Communication Commission: In charge of the Website and Facebook

Selection Commission: In charge of the selection of INDIAN NATIONAL TABLE SOCCER TEAM.

Women's Commission: In charge of the women's welfare & activities.
